



## **NATS Southeastern Region (SERNATS) Student Auditions Application Guidelines (Revised November 2009)**

**About the Auditions:** The purpose of the SERNATS Student Auditions is to offer students of NATS members encouragement toward the preparation of appropriate repertoire, stimulation toward the achievement of vocal and musical growth, the opportunity to sing before qualified and impartial judges and thereby receive careful constructive criticism, and public recognition of musical talent and vocal achievement. Note: Student Auditions are not part of the NATS Artist Awards (NATSAA); see [www.nats.org](http://www.nats.org) for information about this separate event.

Student Auditions are an annual activity officially sponsored by the Southeastern Region, which includes Alabama, Florida, Georgia, Puerto Rico, and the American Virgin Islands. Regional Auditions are held annually, usually in the spring, and may be preceded by District or Chapter Auditions. Students with the highest ratings in the District or Chapter Auditions are encouraged to enter the Regional Auditions, although all students of NATS members are eligible to enter the Regional Auditions regardless of participation in District or Chapter Auditions. Membership of the Southeastern Region may, in their annual meeting, revise or amend these guidelines by a simple majority vote. Student auditions will be conducted with dignity, efficiency, and with consideration for the performers in accordance with established NATS Audition policies.

**Student Eligibility:** Any student currently studying with an active member of NATS and who meets all other requirements herein is eligible. Students who have studied with their current teacher for less than eight months may only participate in Category 19 except a) when there has been no previous training, or b) when the student has studied with a NATS teacher in the past 6 months, and gives credit to both the current and previous teacher by listing them both on the registration forms and, if applicable, in the introductions at the conclusion of the Final Round.

**Teacher Eligibility:** Any teacher who is an active member of NATS, and who resides or teaches in the event's region, district or chapter is eligible to enter students and to serve as an adjudicator at the Student Auditions. **Teachers who enter students in the auditions must serve as adjudicators as assigned by the Event Registrar**, but may not judge their own students. Each teacher may only send students from their own studio (studios cannot be combined), and must be available to adjudicate all the days of the event. A teacher who declines to judge or who finds it impossible to attend the auditions in their entirety must arrange for a substitute judge. If a substitute judge is not secured by the teacher, the teacher's student (s) will be disqualified.

**Important Copyright Information: Performers in NATS-sponsored auditions, competitions, recitals, and other activities such as workshops shall perform from lawful editions and shall support and obey the law relative to copyright. Neither singers nor accompanists may use any pages of photocopied music for any reason during the auditions.** Singers who use photocopied music or non-published keys produced on the computer, including use by the accompanist, or who have it in their possession, will be disqualified, *unless* they have written permission from the publisher in their possession and present this to the adjudicators at the time of the audition. **Securing Accompanists: For the SERNATS Regional Auditions, auditionees are responsible for securing their own accompanists.** A staff accompanist will be available at the audition center for a reasonable fee if one is required. Arrangements must be made for this service by the time of the application deadline. *Please note:* No accompanist may play for more than fifteen auditions (twelve on Friday). One singer singing in two classifications counts as two auditions. Voice teachers may not accompany any singer at the piano at all.

**Expected Attire:** Students singing in every level of the audition are required to dress professionally; students singing in the Final Rounds are not expected to wear formal attire.

**Recording and Photography:** Photographs may be taken by event photographers throughout the event; a photo release is required as part of participation in the Auditions. Participants and guests may take photographs when permitted by event organizers; no video or audio taping of the auditions is allowed.

**Application Information:** Regional application forms are posted when available at [www.sernats.org](http://www.sernats.org). District and chapter applications are posted or distributed separately by those entities. Applications must be filled out completely and mailed *by the teacher* to the registrar by the stated deadline. The application fee and the accompanist fee, if applicable, must accompany each entry in order for the entry to be considered complete. Singers with incomplete entries will not be scheduled for an audition. Checks must be made payable to the appropriate NATS division (e.g. Region, District or Chapter), and must be from the teacher's account; checks from students will not be accepted by the Region.

**Repertoire:** All repertoire must be performed from memory. Vocalises, even a formal work like the Rachmaninoff "Vocalise," may not be sung at the SERNATS auditions. Copyrights are strictly enforced. All music must be accompanied using **original scores**. See "Important Copyright Information" above. All music should be scored for voice and keyboard unless approved in advance by the Event Coordinator. For additional information regarding scores, see the SERNATS Auditions FAQ. Specific repertoire requirements are listed for each Category in the Classification/Categories List below.

**Classification/Categories: For the purposes of these Auditions 34 Categories have been established. Please note that some categories have been assigned new numbers from those of previous Auditions, and some new categories are available in Music Theater.** A student’s classification shall be determined by the amount of vocal study and not academic standing; however, should the student be affected by the age factor, then age limitations determine the appropriate categories. In all categories, the allotted audition time includes transition time from one song or one singer to the next; the time limit represents the audition time slot, not the total singing time. A student may enter in a music theater classification and a classical music classification; registration fees must be paid for both categories.

The categories below are listed by genre, and by length of study, to facilitate determining the correct category(ies) for each singer.

**FOR COMMENTS ONLY: ALL GENRES**

**General Category: For Comments Only**

The “General” category welcomes singers, of any experience level, who wish to sing for written comments and evaluation only; no scores or prizes are given in this category.
